


# What's the rush?

It's important to apply by the end of January so the colleges and sixth forms know (roughly) how many people to expect.

You are reserving your place, but you can always change your mind later!

Once applied, you can focus on your exams!



## FAQs...


**If you are undecided**, apply to more than one place then make up your mind after you have finished your exams, and have some thinking space!

**If you are concerned about your entry requirements**, make sure you apply for a back-up course so it's there if you need it!

**If your worried about sixth form entry requirements**, consider courses with lower entry requirements! You can always change your mind if you do better than expected!

E.g. you want to do Biology (5s in English, Maths & 6s in Science), but you're not sure you will get those grades, it might be better to go for Medical Sciences (4-9 in 5 subjects including Science).

- Application form on website or on letter sent home on Monday.
- Initial deadline: Thursday 29<sup>th</sup> January
- To change subjects, simply re-complete the form or email Mr Richards
- Talk to me/set up a meeting if it would help!





# How to apply...York College

- Google 'York College Apply' or go to <https://www.yorkcollege.ac.uk/apply>
- Find the correct drop down box for your course under 'September 2026 Applications'.  
You will need either Full Time course, T Level course or Apprenticeship.
- Complete the application on the page.
- Complete the application. If you have applied to the college for a Taster Day, you need to log-in using the email / password you used last time.
- If you haven't applied to college before, start a new application.

## Apprenticeship Information



Apprenticeships are a fantastic way to gain real-world experience, earn a wage, and achieve nationally recognised qualifications—all at the same time. They combine practical training in a job with study, allowing you to build valuable skills while working towards a career.

One of the biggest misconceptions about apprenticeships is that they're a fallback for those who don't want to go to university. This couldn't be further from the truth. Apprenticeships are challenging, competitive, and highly respected by employers. They exist in a wide range of industries—from engineering and healthcare to digital marketing, law, and finance. Some even lead to degree-level qualifications, all without the student debt.

Not all apprenticeship opportunities are advertised in one place. To maximise your chances: explore the careers sections of company websites, contact employers directly to ask about potential opportunities, get part-time work in a relevant sector—it can lead to future apprenticeship offers, and stay proactive by checking multiple sources

## More FAQs...

**If an application asks for your estimated/predicted grades**, just put approximately what you are expecting to get (doesn't need to be anything formal).

**If you are planning to do an apprenticeship\*, join the armed forces, go to a specialist college or do a scholarship**, make sure you apply for a back-up course at a York based college or sixth form!

*\*The only exception is if you have applied for an apprenticeship through York College (they will automatically put you on a back up If needed).*
